Pole vault—Dave Wimmer, Fresno High and Lavern Butler, Tulare, tied for fifth at 13 feet.

of 46.7 seconds, breaking the old mark of 47.2 set last year by Eddie Southern of Dallas, Tex.

Homer Robertson of Pacific High, San Bernardino, put the 12 pound shot 63 feet, 9½ inches to break the existing record by an even foot. Don Vick of Chaffee High, Ontario, Calif., owned the old record, set in 1953.

Jefferson High's baton quartet of Joe Batten, Willie White, Terry Randall and Henry Phillips toured the half mile distance in 1 minute, 25.9 seconds to set a relay record and better the existing standard of 1:27.2 set by Jefferson's team last year.

Jefferson High School of Los Angeles far outdistanced the 107 school field to win the team title for the sixth time in 41 years, with 24½ points.

Manual Arts High of Los Angeles, which also has won the team title six times, placed second with 12 points.

A Corcoran High School husky, Wayne Crowe, set a California discus record by hurling the platter 171 feet, 5¼ inches. He beat the 1951 record of 165 feet, 5 inches set by Taff's late
