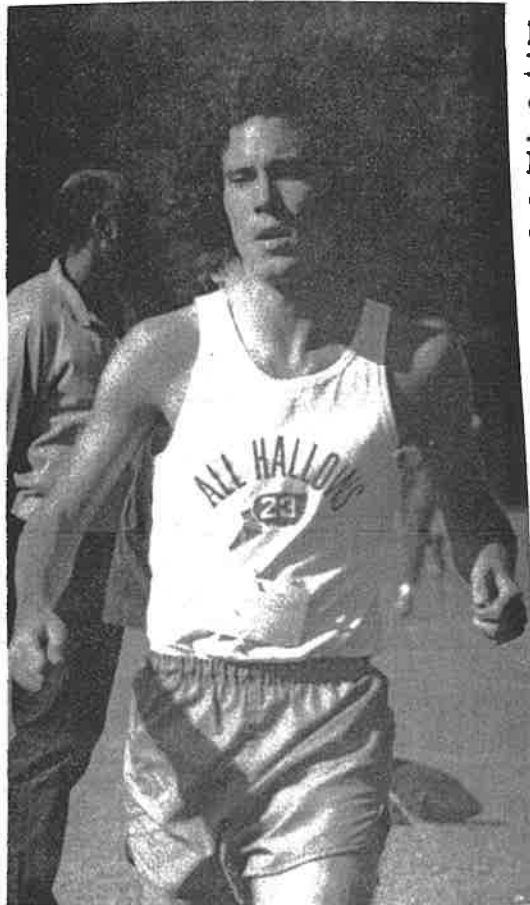

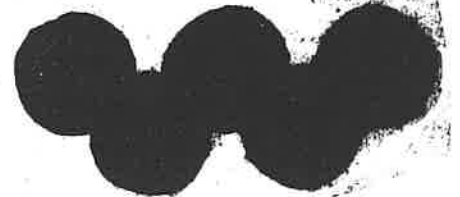

The Settling Dust...

Even though the dust has settled on the cross-country season, much of what happened remains hazy. To look back now and analyze the season is difficult, for all I have now are memories, which have been distorted and influenced. So, as everyone must, I will look over the statistics to try to recall and outline a few of the highlights.

Not too many upsets or surprises were featured in the CHSAA during X-country '73. The scene was pretty well dominated by Gene McCarthy (All Hallows) and Power Memorial.

The All Hallows' flash posted seven victories and no defeats, met almost all top adversaries, and averaged below 12:30 for his races. In the process, he picked up a NY State record at VCP of 12:23.8, which ranks him 3rd on the all-time list.

The Power team was beaten, but not often. The Panther five—Brian Johnston, Art Stolba, Maurice Weaver, Kevin Meuchner and Frank Rafferty—won all major titles except the big one—Eastern States—where they got third. They made a sweep of CHSAA competition, winning the Sectionals and CHSAA Champs, and in all tallied seven wins.

Much overshadowed by McCarthy's exploits, were the fine efforts of some other runners.

Throughout the season, McCarthy's prime competitor was Molloy's Mark Ogden. The red-headed senior would have boasted a clean record if not for his three losses to Gene. Ogden ran a best of 12:29, which ranks him 2nd this year and 8th all-time at VCP. He won at Man. Inv. (where he ran the fastest time), St. John Inv. and Privates Champs, to name a few. He also placed a close 2nd at Eastern States.

Other standouts were Brian Johnston and Art Stolba of Power. Johnston placed 2nd in the Sectionals with 12:41, and Stolba ran 4th with 12:47 at CHSAA's. Pete and Steve Croke led St. Anthony's to a fine season. Steve placed 3rd and Pete 9th in the CHSAA's. Paul Buttermark (St. Peter)

also deserves recognition for his 12:43 and low placings, along with all the others who ran during the season, and helped make it what it was.

RUNNING NOTES

On Nov. 25, in the 4-mile cross-country run at Van Cortlandt, Ed Valenski (formerly from Maria Regina) placed 1st in 20:20. Placing 3rd was Mike Hagon of Suffern HS, running a fine 20:41. Bishop Loughlin entered a full team. They were led by Al Paris (21:23) and Paul Kaftanski (21:28). Times were slowed considerably by the heavy rains... Msgr Farrell's team has some future if the freshman can keep up the good work. They had a fantastic record and some outstanding performers. Tom Cuffe broke Paul Buttermark's course record at Clove Lakes. He ran the varsity course at Temple and broke the frosh record of 16:25 by 24 seconds. Mike Hart and Mike Sayers were also under the old record. Also, four runners went under 8:00 for Farrell on the Clove Lakes course this year. Prior to this only three had ever done it!.. Rich Walsh, resident of S.I., but runner for LaSalle, was voted to receive a special award for outstanding X-country performance, by the S.I. track coaches... In a mile run in Staten Is., Joe Walsh (Farr) won by nipping Paul Buttermark (St. Peters), Buttermark led through the race in 68, 2:17.8, and 3:22.8, before Walsh came up, on the inside. They battled the last 440 and Walsh managed a slight lead he kept to the tape. The times were 4:24.6 and 4:26.8... In the Lou Marci Run (Nov. 22), Rich Walsh (LaSalle) took 12th running 15:23 for 3-miles. Gene Spillane of Farrell was 16th (15:47) and his coach, George Kochman, was 21st in 16:00. Vin Fea (Farr) ran 16:08...

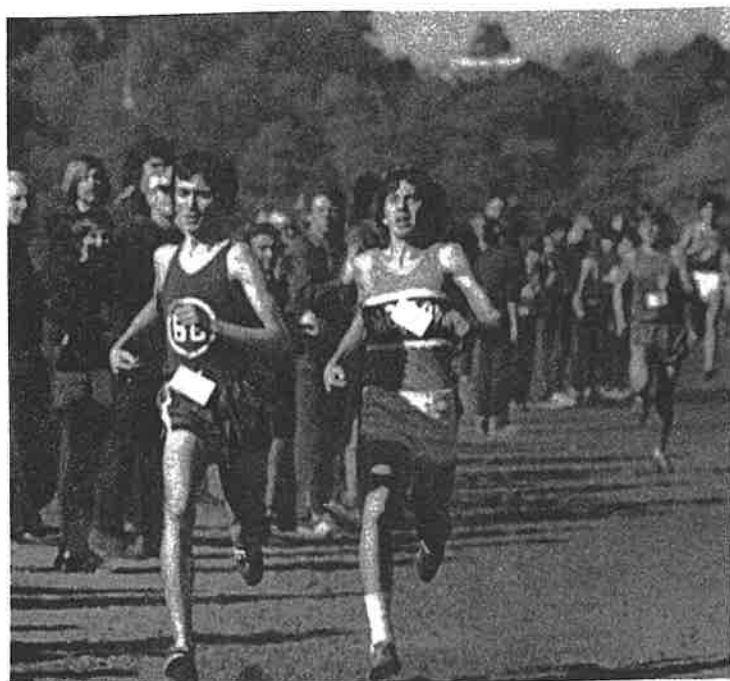

MANHATTAN BORO CHAMPS-NOV. 15-

LaSalle Academy came away with their first team title of the season in this meet of 8 catholic schools.

Myles Corrigan(LaSalle)led from gun to tape to win by a huge margin over Rice's Joe Dern. Another LaSalle runner,Larry Brown, placed 3rd, followed by Brendan Sheehy(Cathedral). Then Rich Walsh and Kevin Mooney came 5th and 6th to assure a LaSalle win.

Power did not run their top men, but still placed Al Fiorentino and Bill Dailey in the top ten, and took 2nd in the team standings.

The JV race was all Power and Xavier as the two teams dominated the top places. The race was won by Panther Bill Crawford. He was trailed closely by Cathedral's Frank Lindsay and Bolivar Saa(Xavier). Power won with 33 pts, and Xavier was next with 54 pts.

STATEN ISLAND CHAMPS-NOV. 20&21-

Isgr. Farrell put together a fine team effort to claim title to "Staten Island's best". Joe Walsh(Farrell) put in a gutsy race and won in 12:47 on the Clove Lakes course(the second fastest time ever run on that course). Joe led St.Peter's star, Paul Buttermark, for much of the race, but when Walsh pulled away on the last hill, Buttermark faded badly, leaving Walsh to finish victoriously.

Farrell runners occupied the next two places. John Daly, recovering from a case of tendonitis, ran 2nd in 13:19, and Frank Dawson was third in the time of 13:21.

Susan Wagner nudged ahead of St. Peter's for 2nd place, both teams placed two in the top fifteen.

Farrell went on to win all the other titles handily. In the Jv "A" they scored 20 points, led by Denis O'Brien and Stave Lamb. In the Frosh "A" the Farrell team scored a perfect 15, taking the top six places.

In the JV Tom Meagher(Loughlin) coasted to a convincing victory over Kevin Cole(Paramus), but again St. Joe's came streaming in (3rd,4th,5th) to wrap up the team title.

St. Peter's runners won the A and B races in the freshman section, but each time they faltered to 2nd and CBA Lincroft claimed both races.

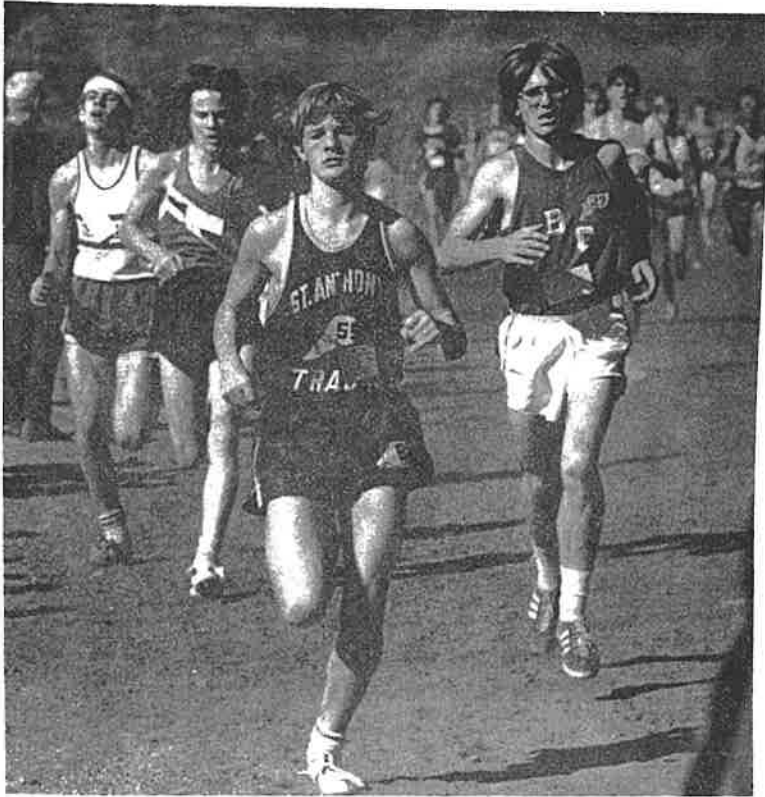

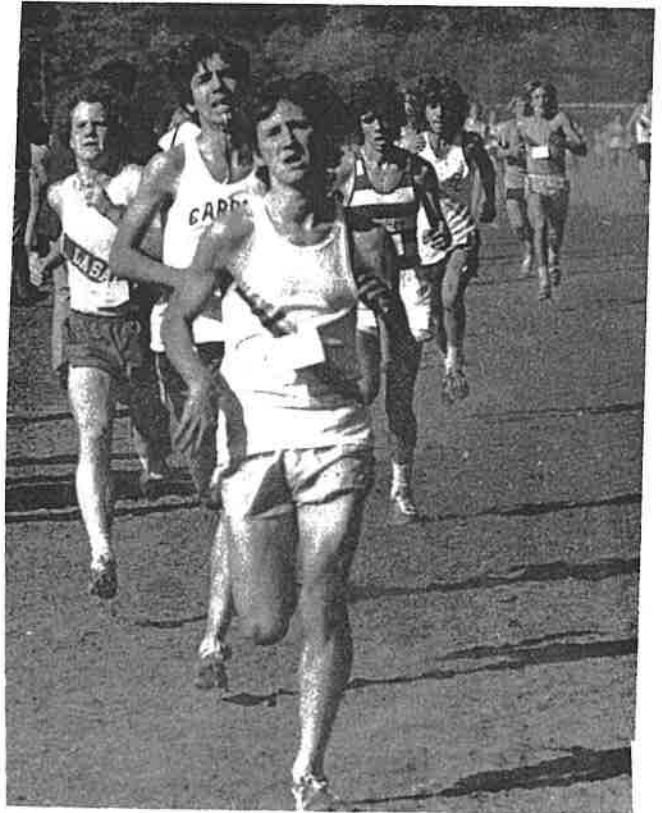

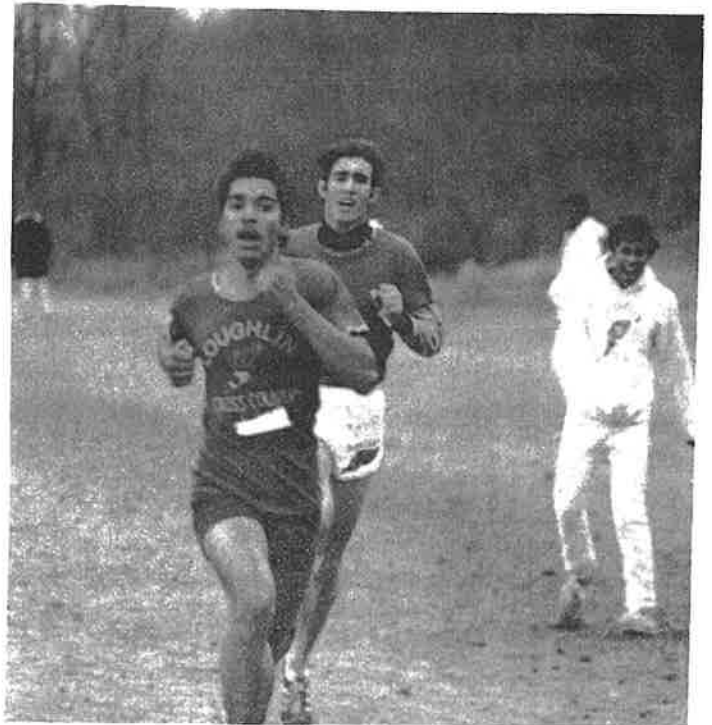
