Turner and Stanley Tops Among Preps

Steve Turner of Glendale and Lang Stanley of Jefferson were named Track and Field Athletesof-the-Year in the CIF and City, respectively, yesterday by the Helms Athletic Foundation's All-Southern California Board of Athletics.

Both choices were unanimous. Turner, the most outstanding all-around performer in recent CIF annals, excelled in both hurdles and the broad jump and in his 220-yard stint on the relay team. He set a new national interscholastic 180-yard low hurdle mark of 18.9s. and boasted a mark of 14.1s., just a 10th of a second of the national record, in the 120 highs.

The Glendale High cinder sensation also came forth with the top prep broad jump in the West this season — 24ft, 6½ in.

Stanley, star of stars of the State championship Jefferson High team, chalked up a new national interscholastic 880 mark of 1m. 53.9s, in the State meet at Sacramento when he erased Ross Bush's 17-year-old record of 1m, 54.4s.
