Molloy Crowned Again

CHSAA CHAMPS, MAR 2-STATE ARMORY-

Archbishop Molloy repeated as indoor champs in a very definite manner,

The Stanners won only two events, the shot and high jump, but displayed an awesome amount of depth, placing in nine of the fifteen events.

Greg Little set the only meet record, dashing the 300 in 32.6 to break his own standard. He beat second placeer, Bob McBride(Farrell) by two yards.

In the 2-mile, Loughlin's Tim Behr used a devastating kick to clock a 9:17.2. Behr was hesitant to take the lead, so Pete Crooke(St.Anth) and Paul Buttermark(St.Peter) took turns at the pacework. With 880 yds. to go, Behr looked tired, but managed to hold on to the rapid leaders. Two laps from the finish Timmy took control and sprinted in on the last lap. Buttermark managed to hold off a fast finishing Gary Conroy(Molloy) to place 2nd in 9:20.9. Conroy ran 9:22.0.

Willie Sutton(Spellman) won his 2nd century title in so many weeks, Here the speedster clocked 10.6 in the finals and 10.5 in the trials. The week before he won the NY Section 100.

Steve Crooke took the lead in the mile at the halfway mark, which he passed in 2:10.5. The St. Anthony's senior strided in his usual intent and serious manner. He ran the last half all alone and won by a landslide in 4:21.1. Mark Ogden(Molloy), who was not seeded in the event, ran the 2nd section, also all by himself. He still managed to register a 4:26. which placed him second over- all.

The 1000 may have been the most stacked race of the meet. Ron Stafford(Maria Regina) took an early lead, but Joe Walsh(Farrell) took over after the first lap. The pack passed the 440 in 58.0 and the 880 in 2:01.3. Stafford applied his kick around the turn and won easily in 2:17.8. Maurice Weaver (Power) showed the experience of a senior, for he was the only one with a kick down the stretch. The soph placed 2nd in 2:18.2.

Monsignor Farrell won the freshman division 22-20 over St. Francis Prep.

CHRISTIAN BROS. MAR 5- ARMORY-

La Salle(NY) won the team title in in the closest call of the season. over CBA,Lincroft. With only the HJ remaining, LaSalle led Christian Brothers, 25- 23½. There were four jumpers still in,,two from CBA two from LaSalle!

As it turned out, LaSalle men Ian Drayton and Mark Pace salvaged the championship for their team by placing 2nd and 3rd. Final score-LSA, 32; CBA, 31½!!!!

Willie Sutton(Spellman) applied his sprinting prowess to the 220 and turned in the fastest in the league, 23.6. Running in another heat, was second placer Kevin Mooney from LaSalle, who could have run faster if in the first heat.

The 880 was a slow, tactical race. Bill Hogan(Spellman) and Rich Walsh (LaSalle) ran together in second the whole race. At the gun, Hogan darted away in pursuit of first, but began to tie up down the straight Walsh came up and nipped him for 2nd. Both were given the time 2:02.5.

The freshman 50 was won by Bill Clark in a super East time of 6.0. The Loughlin frosh also tied for first in the 220 with Tom Barrett of LaSalle. The two were clocked in 24.7 Al Paris(Lough) won the mile in an unchallenged 4:22.7. Kevin O'Leary (Sacred Ht) led for three laps and looked ready for a fine race until a sudden foot injury forced him to drop out. At the half, Larry Brown, LaSalle, was up front with Paris on his shoulder. Paris was in the lead soon, pushing the pace, and on the last lap ran away from the opposition. Paul Kaftanski(Lough) came up on Brown in the closing yards to steal 3rd. Both were timed in 4:30.0.

The 2-mile pace was not fast, but from it Mike O'Donnell emerged the victor. The St.Peter jr. ran a well paced race, staying with the pack for a while before running his own race. When the gun went off, Mike had plenty left and drove home in 9:47.0.

Power ... All City Champs



EASTERN STATES, MARCH 6-JADWIN GYM, N.J. C. SAA athletes had their share of glory and tough breaks, in this, the most exciting and highest quality meet of the year. Running on an unbanked 220 rubberized oval, that many gaped at in disbelief and commented it looked like Penn's facility, athletes turned in a number of nat'l record. A couple of CHSAA standards went under, also.

Paul Buttermark (St. Peter) proved to be the only leaguer to win in an individual contest. The tall, dark haired senior kept in 3rd for the first half before moving up. With a 440 to go, Paul got on the leader's shoulder and pushed the pace. On the backstretch of the last lap, he gracefully moved away and glided to an easy mile win-4:16.2.

St. Anthony's distance medley was the other league winner. The foursome of Mike Mullady, John Folan, Pete Crooke and Steve Crooke, led all the way, and increased their lead with every lap. Pete's 3:08.7 3/4 leg broke the Friar's completely away, and Steve's 4:20.2 anchor assumed the team of the CHSAA record- 10:22.6. This broke Power's 10:22.8 set earlier this season.

Power's mile relay, and especially Daryl Everett, did something right. After Greg Little, Ken Malone and Julio Rivera did their work, Everett was 2nd about 4 yards behind. He waited the first lap, then made his move. Down the last stretch, the Power senior closed the gap, but fell just short at the tape. Everett's leg was an eye popping 49.2. Power's team team 3:24.0!!!!

Tim Behr strided to the fastest 2-mile in the league this year. The Loughlin senior hung in 4th all the way up to the last lap. At the gun Tim moved up a place with a good kick and recorded a fine 9:16.2. Gary Conroy (Molloy) won the unseeded section in 9:18.4 to place 5th overall.

John Daly surprised himself and many others with his amazing 2:13.4 1000. The huge senior from Farrell just went with the pace that produced a nat'l record, and hung on. He had a fast kick at the end and actually closed on Belger in the last straightaway. In 3rd was Regina's Ron Stafford, who set a state class record with his 2:13.6.

MAYOR'S MEET, STATE ARMORY-March 9- Power got its revenge on the Molloy team by being crowned the all-city champions of 1974. The Panthers outdid the Stanners by the score of 26- 22. The PSAL supposedly outdid the CHSAA, 97- 95, but the fact that the PSAL had many more teams competing may have had something to do with that.

Maurice Weaver waited until this last meet to enter into the winners circle. The Power soph won the 1000 with a fast kick off a very slow pace. The runners passed the 880 in 2:02 and Weaver just used his speed to win in 2:18.5.

St. Francis' mile relay won another title, this time with a slightly different team. They turned in their best time of the year-3:31.0, as Gerry Martori ran a 51.7 anchor.

Talking about fast 440's, Greg Little turned a nice trick in the individual race. The Power senior, who finally was freed from the relays, didn't waste this last opportunity to rip off a fast one. Coming off the final turn, he was third, but he used his strength to drive into second. The time was a fantastic 50.5!!!! In fourth place was Xaverian standout Bob Murach.

Paul Buttermark (St. Peter) wasn't going for the time after his hard race at the Eastern's three days previous. Still he turned in a highly respectable 4:19.7 and defeated Brian Johnston (4:21.3) and Joe Walsh of Farrell (4:24.0).

In the high jump, John Schilling had a sort of a vacation. The premier jumper of the league, Joe Dombrowski did not show up. The Molloy senior won the event at 6-5, and another Stanner, Mike McManus, took 5th in 6-2.

In the 600, Hugh Gaffney fought hard down the last stretch and nearly pulled out a victory. The Xaverian runner clocked 1:15.1 to place 3rd. Power's Daryl Everett won second in 1:14.7.



EVEING THE LEAGUE

FROM CHSAA CHAMPS!.....Rick Stuart, who had been out with a case of the flu, came back to win the shot with a commendable 57-10½. This ranks the Molloy junior 10th on the all-time CHSAA list.....Julio Rivera ran an inspired race in the 440 final. The Power junior had a slight leg injury and needed tape on his thigh. In the race it was evident he was not 100%, and coming off the final turn he was a distant third. Down the stretch, however, he let everything go and came within a breath of catching Tom Cody of Molloy. The two runners were given the identical time of 51.7, but Julio was rendered third.....The St. Francis mile relay has made its presence felt over the past month. In the Nassau County Relays, Brooklyn-Queens Sectionals and more lately the CHSAA Champs, they were victorious. The team of Pete Tittman, Ben Fenderson Paul Ferrara and Gerry Martori have run a best of 3:31.3.....In the 2-mile relay, Rich Degnan brought his team to a narrow victory over Loughlin, as he outlegged Al Paris. The two seniors got the baton about the same time and moved up together from 3rd place. On the last lap Degnan(Trinity) strided away and held on to the lead despite a late surge by Paris. The splits were "Degs"-1:57.7; Paris-1:58.2... ..Gene McCarthy(All Hallows) did not run this meet and will probably be out for the rest of the indoor season. "I wanted to get the national record (Pete Gaughn's 4:13.1 nat'l flatfloor), but the doctor said it would be best to stay off it. It's not serious but it would get worse if I ran on it. I'll be ready to go outdoors though!" Gene is suffering from a leg injury.... ..Jim Moore(St. Anthony), who has been improving on relays all season, came to the fore with his 4:36.3 6th placing here. His coach, Hal Rothman, was so overjoyed with his performance, he almost forgot to congratulate his other prize pupil, Steve Crooke who had won the race.....George McCutcheon(Regina) was another steadily improving athlete who made himself noticed in the championships. He ran his best- 4:28.0- leading the pace for a while, and when he got tired, bravely clung to the heels of Brian Johnston who ran 4:27.....John Daly(Farrell) gave some indication of what was to come with his 1:57.6 880 win. Ed Gardner(St. John) was second, all alone in 1:59.7.Kevin Clark had 3rd all wrapped up and was making a strong bid for 2nd, when he tripped!! It was very disappointing, some thought he had a chance of winning before the race. I was sure the Mount St. Michael runner had the race wrapped up when he came around for the last lap in first place looking very strong.....Larry Brown(LaSalle) ran his best 1000, with an illness no less. The tall senior ran 6th in a very talented field turning in a 2:20.7.....Al Fiorentino, soph from Power, continues to improve. In the two-mile relay here, the dark-haired runner brought his team from third to first with his quick 2:00.8.....Joe Garland, Iona Prep senior, ran his best 600 while placing 4th in the race. His 1:16.1 is a great improvement over his early season 1:20.2.....Charlie McDermott and Bob Darr staged a very exciting pole vault battle in the Columbia Bubble. McDermott(LaSalle junior) made 11-0 and 11-6 on first attempts. Both times however, he hit the bar and it just stayed up by prayers. At 12-0 it took each jumper two tries to scale. When the bar was moved to 12-6, neither jumper managed it. Since there was a tie, a jumpoff was needed. With the bar at 12-6, Darr(Xaverian) missed on all three tries, but the LaSalle jr. made it, thus winning the title!.....Daryl Everett had a close call in the 600 due to a hard drive by Harry Gaffney(Xaverian). Everett took the lead on the backstretch and lengthened it around the turn. Coming down the last few yards the Power senior began to slow down, which spurred Gaffney to let the stoppers loose!! It was a photo finish, and Everett fell and tumbled as he hit the tape. He rose in time to signal to his applauding teammates that he was the victor. Both were times in 1:14.8,,,,,.....

Eastern States Spectacular

Once again I bummed a ride from Brother Bielen and the Power team. I sincerely thank them for tolerating my presence yet another trip, and promised them this write-up in payment.

As we drove up to Jadwin Gym, I thought it a queer looking structure. One Power runner observed that it looked like a giant turtle shell, and it does. Only from the outside though. As we walked inside, we were struck by the hugeness of the arena and walked with our eyes gaping in the air. I looked around searching for the track only to discover I was standing on it. "Unbelievable!" I said, "The track is built right into the floor!" It was green with numerous lanes, and made of a soft spongy substance. Right then I knew fast times were in the making.

As might be expected, the meet ran about an hour behind schedule, but no one seemed to care. At least I didn't. In fact, I wished the meet would go on all night it was so enjoyable. If the events were sent off in rocket fire order, the great times would not have a time to set in. I really don't know how to explain the performances. Just let me say that there were so many records (class, national, state, league, etc.) that one had trouble keeping on top of them all. Of course the times are not comparable to those run on the Armory floor, since spikes and blocks were used. Some estimated that it knocked a full second off your time for every 440 run, but I'm not sure about that.

I hope the Eastern's will be run at Jadwin Gym every year to come. As long as you get the best athletes together, you might as well give them the best facility.

JUST FROM THE TRACK: John Daly(Farrell) was originally scheduled to run in the unseeded section of the 1000. He explains the circumstances that led to his being seeded and eventual 2:13.4 performance. "Someone didn't show up in the seeded section, and since I was the next one I moved up. I'm really surprised at my time, I felt so good though!....If I had started my kick earlier I probably could have caught Belger!.... Ron Stafford(Regina) set a state junior record while placing third in that race. His 2:13.6 is a tenth off the national junior record.....Many runners were disqualified in the sprints for running out of their lane too soon. Two CHSAAers, Tony Brancato(Holy Cross) and Harry Gaffney(Xaverian) were penalized for this, which is unfortunate. They both ran fine races and personal bests. Gaffney ran a strong finishing 1:14.6 to win the first heat of the 600. Brancato had 4th in his heat in the 300 with 33.4.Power's 3:24.0 mile relay ties them with the leading mark in the nation this season.....Stg. Anthony's 10:22.6 is also a nation pacer.... After running two events the night before, the mile and the 880, Al Pairs anchored the Loughlin two-mile relay with a 1:57.0. To add to the story, he ran it all alone, 20 yards behind the pack!!!.....

OTHER NOTES: CHSAA ON THE NATIONAL SCENE!!.....From the latest edition of Track & Field News I state the following.....Power's distance medley now ranks second in the nation with Loughlin 4th, All Hallows 5th and Molloy 6th..... McCarthy is ranked 6th in the mile and Buttermark's 4:16.2 would rank him in the top eight.....Buttermark's 1:56.7 would be in the top also.....Joe Dombrowski's 6-7 would be in the top 10.....John Daly's 1000 is a nation leader and would rank 2nd behind Belger..... Stafford's run would be 3rd.....All Hallows' 2-mile relay is ranked first with Loughlin 3rd.....Maria Regina's sprint medley is rated no. 1 with Chaminade third.....McCarthy's and Mitchell's 1000's are also highly touted.....As you can see, the CHSAA is a center for talent for the indoor season!!!!!!.....

THE MOLLOY WAY - - - Winning

Why is Molloy such a consistent winner? Here is what head coach, Mr. Anthony Perrone has to say about the following topics.

Q:What makes Molloy a winner?
A:Tradition- over 600 team titles and 20,000 medals since 1960.

Experienced staff- over 50 years of experience total- 4 coaches.

Academic quality of students- they are easily motivated.

Q:What kind of recruiting do you do?
A:We don't go out and talk to any grammar school athletes. The school only takes the very top scoring students on the entrance exam, so we don't have any idea of athletes until Sept. In Sept., we make one call for track men and we generally get 50-60 frosh come out. That number increases during the year to 75 or so.

Q:How about philosophy on training?
A: Starting on the frosh level we encourage slow, gradual development with individual motivation and goal setting. We don't take attendance and seldom have formal practice on "off" days, but do encourage daily practice. We don't do very much track work, most of the work is long runs. Many of the early meets are used as workouts- competitive speed workouts- so we do not look that good during the early season. During each season, we stress the team's and individual goal or peak meet- the champs- so that there is one peak meet per season.

Q:How do you keep the team as a workable unit? You have a large team.
A: This is the hardest part of the job- trying to keep everyone goal orientated when it is so easy to overlook the average runner. What I try to do in many meets is to set up teams with some very good and average runners, so that the average runner feels that he has a chance. We often try to make up two equal teams, so that in many meets we don't finish first, but have two average teams getting medals. We also run development meets for the average runner on days of the large mixed meets such as

the Hayes or St. Francis Games. That we have found really keeps the frosh and sophs and slow developing jrs. and seniors interested.

CLOSE-UP

RICK STUART, MOLLOY, SHOT**

The 6-0, 245 lb. shot- putter had one of the best seasons in the CHSAA this year.

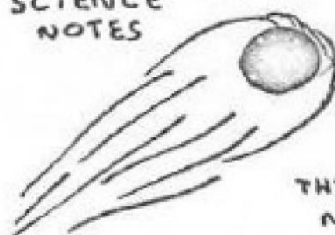
His best effort was 57-10½, which earned him the CHSAA title, and he is only a junior. In addition, Rick threw 56-5½ to get 6th at the Eastern's, along with a 4th placing in the Mayor's Meet.

"I lift heavy three times a week (Mon., Wed. and Friday). I concentrate on Olympic lifts, Squats and Incline Bench Presses. I do all these in an organized workout. On Tuesday and Thursday I throw, concentrating on technique. If it rains I go through a routine of gymnastics & tumbling. "I hope to throw 62- 63 feet this outdoor season, and next year between 65- 67. I also hope to receive invitations to the Golden West and other meets at the end of the season"

Molloy has enjoyed great success with their field team over the years. I asked Rick what he felt the reason was. "I think the combination of our facilities, with the will to achieve that is in all out athletes is our secret. Plus the fact that Mr. Thompson and Bro. Patrick Hogan are two of the best field event coaches in the city today."

About his own secret to success: "I feel both physical strength and mental toughness are my greatest assets. I also think the fact that I have great teammates to push me is a great help." BESTS: SHOT-57-10½ Javelin-156-0..

GREG LITTLE, POWER MEM.

In the last meet of the season, the Power senior ripped off the fastest 440 in the CHSAA this year, 50.5. This ranks him highly on the all-time list, also.

Greg was the number one man in the 300, with a best of 32.6 which won him the CHSAA title for the second year in a row. He also ran superbly on Power's relays that ran 10:22.6 (Distance Medley) and 3:24.0, which is tied for the lead of the nation.

Greg looked ahead to outdoors and stated his goals. "I hope for a 48.0 440 off the leg, and under a 21.5 in the 220, off start. As for team goals, we want to win the mile relay at the Penn Relays."

The school is but a few blocks away from Central Park, and the team does most of its outdoor running there. "Since we have no track, we go to the park to work. Bro. Bielen gives us our workouts there."

It is quite an experience to watch his powerful sprinter explode in the last straightaway of a race. It is as if a bomb goes off, he drives with the arms and kicks his legs far out in front of him. I've never seen Greg tie up at the end of a race!...BESTS:220-21.4;300-32.6;440-50.5.....

ALBERT PARIS, LOUGHLIN

Al has done his most outstanding racing on relays, and thus has not gained the acclaim he deserves. In the mold of a classical iron man, the Loughlin senior pounds out sub-2:00 halves with amazing consistency.

That's not to say he hasn't gained merit on individual stints though. Al won the Christian Bros. mile in 4:22.7, and ran from the front all the way in the Brooklyn-Queens CHSAA 880 to register a fine 1:59.6. Also, he placed third in the Hayes 1000 with a clocking of 2:19.3.

"I train twice a day. I do 5 miles in the morning, and whatever Mr. Bowes tells me to in the afternoon. I average between 55-60 miles a week." Fifty-five miles may not sound like much, but whenever I see Loughlin working out, they're going hard. So that mileage is a lot of quality!

As goals he mentions: "A 1:55.0 off start and 1:53.0 off leg in the 880. For the mile I'd like to run 4:15.0. An outdoor CHSAA title in some event is also my goal. Our distance medley and two mile relay teams hope to win at Penn Relays."

Under the pressure of teammate Tim Behr, Al told me to put that he loves Catalina, a girl on the Loughlin team.

LET ME MAKE THIS PERFECTLY CLEAR

Let me start off by saying that the picks are not how I think the runners would place in a race among them, but rather they are based on the athlete's competitive record and outstanding performances. 100-Sutton won both the NY Sectionals and CHSAA titles. No other 100 man was unbeaten, also fastest time. Smith had high places in many meets and Capano just beat out McNamara for 3rd spot....300-Little, no match. McBride 2nd in CHSAA and good time. Close for 3rd among Vasta, Brancato and Green, but Green beat them in CHSAA.. 440-Murach CHSAA, B-Queens champ, good times...Rivera 3rd at CHSAA good competitive record...Little in close with Malverty. Little raced the distance only once but great time.....600-Everett dominated...Gaffney good places at Mayor's, CHSAA and sectionals...Mullady and Garland close but not close enough....880-Daly CHSAA champ 1:57.8...Buttermark best time even though he ran it only once, lack of competition places him here....Walsh 3rd in CHSAA and 4th in sectionals, close with Paris, but better competitive record.....Mile-McCarthy injured but still beat Buttermark whenever they met.....Buttermark clear pick...Crooke good times and places close with Ogden and Johnston.....1000-Stafford fast times CHSAA and sectional champ other good places.

Please accept my congratulations on your most informative CHSAA production and keep up the wonderful work.

While not prone to letter writing, I am enclosing some comments for your use now and in the future in three areas (1) A home-stretch disqualification (2) Use of Inspectors and (3) Coaches' compliments.

"CROOKE vs. CONROY"

With interest Have I followed the above controversy which I believe to be nothing more than an obvious infraction justifiably called to the attention, and ultimately ruled upon by the Referee of the December 22, 1973 CHSAA Relays. CHSAA official, Dick Teetsel succinctly stated his case in your January 23, 1974 edition; you, Brian, chose to summarize a conversation with the St. Anthony (Crooke) coach in your February 3 edition whereby he attempted to justify his runners' actions.

Risking pouring more oil on the fire I have to get the following off my chest. Teetsal, one of the finest officials around, also was the best positioned individual (i.e. the wall-side of the finish line) to observe the continuing infraction that commenced at the head of the homestretch, and had him backed up to the wall in self defense.

I have seen Crooke and Gary Conroy, both excellent and experienced runners participate for 4 years on this same armory floor which they know like the palm of their hand.

Steve's course in this race took him diagonally from the head to the end of the homestretch, forcing Gary closer and closer to the wall to such a degree that the latter physically could not pass him on the outside without scraping the wall and/or running into the timer backed against the wall. Crooke's intent was more pronounced by the fact that approximately 5- 10 yards from the tape, he veered left slightly and looked to his left for his challenger who would have had to cut back (and he did so) if he was to successfully pass Crooke.

That Conroy's closing progress was impeded is further reflected by the distance separating the two at the finish line, about 2 yards or 3/10 of a second- and not the 7 yards claimed by one of the most ardent supporter of Steve.

It is the reported position of the St. Anthony coach that I cannot understand, i.e. that the barriers that outlines the track were 3 feet out causing a narrower track down the stretch that was also cluttered by lapped runners. To me, such a claim is not only untenable but holds about as much water as an unclogged collander.

As to the barrier, I presume he means the wooden inside border which is placed in segments upon a white painted border line, the work product of a survey and used for over 35 yrs. without incident. There are no barriers on the outside of the track except the cement block wall. Furthermore, at the end of the chute (beyond the fenced turn) the finish line is extended an additional 4 feet inside the projected interior border allowing for more room at the finish.

As to the lapped runners who were running at a slower than 10:00 pace, there were no more than 2 who were in the inside lane and running in single file- no problem for Steve or Gary whose last quarters were run in 66.1 and 65.6 respectively.
